This has been an incredibly busy month for our care staff as we welcomed 9 high risk infants into our homes. Baby **Die** is undergoing serial casting to correct congenital orthopedic deformities and baby **Meng** is currently in the hospital for anal atresia surgery. Little boys **Bo** and **Cheng** are doing well at home, but we believe Bo may have some very serious brain damage.

We also said goodbye to 8 precious little ones. Of the babies who passed away, 4 (**Lei**, **Bing**, **Yu** and **Qiao**) were new arrivals who were unable to withstand the effects of abandonment in the harsh winter climate of northern China. Baby **Guo** was accepted for hospice care and only lived a few hours after he arrived. Although these babies did not have much time with us we are still grateful for the opportunity to have loved and comforted them in their last hours.
