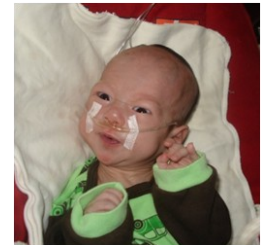
**New and Precious Faces**

This month we saw many new babies come to China Little Flower.

Twins **Fang** and **Yu** arrived bat-

tling dehydration and jaundice along with both weighing under two kilograms. Sadly, Baby Fang passed away last

week, but, praise God, Baby Yu is holding on. Baby **Xiao** was born with a tumor and came to us after his operation. Baby **Ning** was born with an ear deformity and may have some hearing problems but is otherwise a healthy, beautiful baby girl. Baby **Yun** was born with a cleft palate and has been slow to gain weight.



Baby **Tong** was born with anal atresia and is now recovering from surgery in our care. Baby **Le** came to us as a baby with a heart defect, but he is also dealing with some fluid buildup in his head and other issues. Baby **Fei** was born with several serious heart defects, meaning that this little one has a long way to go before he's strong enough to get the surgeries that will help make him even stronger. Though Baby **Long** is almost a year old, he is still the size of many of his younger companions in the baby home because of the many sicknesses he has fought through. He is currently healthy and working on the big task of getting big and strong enough to have corrective



surgery for his cleft palate. Baby **Ye** is currently the smallest baby in the home, weighing just a kilogram and a half, and is bundled up in blankets to keep her warm while her body learns to regulate itself and grow.
